HOME SCHOOL AGREEMENT

In your child's planner (p9/10) you will find our Home School Agreement. It's really important that parents and carers take two minutes to read this. We know that children get the most from their education when we all work together.

As a school we will endeavour to keep to our promises and strive to help the children keep to theirs.

All we ask of you is:

- To ensure your child attends school regularly, on time and properly equipped
- To inform us of any concerns or problems that may affect your child's work or behaviour
- To encourage your child to show kindness, consideration and respect to others
- To encourage your child to be enthusiastic about learning, to do their best and to enjoy and share in experiences with us
- To support our policies and guidelines for behaviour
- To attend parent/carer evenings, discussions about your child's progress and school events
- To support your child in their homework and opportunities for daily/regular reading

SCHOOL UNIFORM

We believe school uniforms provide a sense of belonging for pupils. They are helpful in fostering a good learning environment and promote the ethos of our school. Uniform can also reduce peer pressure at school for the latest clothes and help children feel settled in the learning environment. We also recognise that branded uniforms can be costly for parents, which is why we do not insist on pupils needing them. You can buy BVS uniform items from a wide range of shops (hopefully at really competitive prices).

At Bure Valley we have a clear uniform policy which we make available to parents and carers online and via your child's planner (p6). We ask all parents to support this, particularly when it comes to footwear. Black shoes or all black trainers please.

To help reduce costs further we regularly host pre-loved uniform sales. Please look out for these in the coming months.









This week, the children have been remembering the Queen. Here are some of their messages, sadly we do not have room to share them all.
