Your child's education and development across key stage two is as much of your responsibility as it is ours.

To achieve our goals, and to prepare our pupils for high school we need your help and really want to work with you.

We know that many of our families know and regularly follow the tips outlined on page two of this newsletter, but it is our duty to help parents to support their children.

Tips to help you keep up with what's happening at the school:

- Make sure your child gives you any letters or messages that are sent home;
- Look out for notices and texts for parents;
- Check our website or social media pages;
- Try to make it to school events and to parents' evenings/meetings. Especially if you have received a personal invite:
- If you are worried about anything, please talk to us or use your child's planners to communicate back and forth.

Tips to support learning at home:

- Show interest in your child's homework, whatever age they are. As your child gets older, you may feel less connected to their school experience. By showing interest in their homework, it not only shows you care but will also give you an insight into what they are learning and how they are progressing;
- Set up a designated space for homework (somewhere that is calm and uncluttered);
- Set a routine and make sure your child completes their homework tasks;
- Studies show that reading for pleasure makes a big difference to children's educational
 performance. Evidence suggests that children who read for enjoyment every day not
 only perform better in tests than those who don't, but also develop a broader
 vocabulary, increased general knowledge and a better understanding of other cultures;
- If we know that reading is the key to success, make reading a part of your daily life at home. Bedtime is a traditional reading time, but if it doesn't work for you think about other slots and opportunities;
- Treat children to books, new books, used books, borrowed books, it doesn't matter. Help them to read and check they are reading;
- Talk about what you or they are reading. Let children read to you and you read to them;
- If your child is still at the early stages of learning to read, work with us to get them reading
 independently and for pleasure. Come to our phonics workshop and learn how to help
 you child progress.

Thinking ahead:

- Encourage your child to join an after-school club or local group;
- Tell your child how proud you are when they do well;
- Let them hear you praising them to other people;
- Talk together about their future and the kind of job they think they would enjoy. Have high aspirations for them. They are all capable of achieving great things;
- Ask them to help you with things they are good at;
- Help your child to learning how to regulate themselves and manage their emotions and feelings.

Seek support and advice if you feel you need it. We may not have all the answers, but we are here to help.


