MRS HAYCOCKS

As Mr Olney has already mentioned in his letter, we are all saddened with the news that Joy passed away earlier this week. Joy had been in hospital for a while, however, last week, she was able to come back to her home in Aylsham and be with her family.

Joy was part of BVS for many years, from when the school was known as Aylsham Junior school, then Aylsham Middle school and currently Bure Valley



School. After she retired, she continued to be involved in school life, sometimes as a stand in teacher, but over the last few years with coaching/teaching the netball teams. As her Yr6 pupils left BVS, they would then graduate on to Wednesday night netball, including league matches in Norwich.

Many, many years ago, back in the 80s, when Joy's daughter, Jenny (Centre), myself (Wing Defence) and a group of our friends left Aylsham Middle school for Aylsham high school, we were upset to learn that there would be no netball at high school, only hockey! Determined not to give up on our love of netball, we would practise at lunch time and after school and were able to join a league, which meant regular trips to Norwich. Joy would give up her evenings taking us to these matches, driving us in the school minibus - she wasn't going to see us girls lose out on our netball! Some of the Norwich teams could be rather intimidating for us Aylsham girls... but then Joy would appear and it would be them quaking in their Dunlop Green Flash plimsoles!

That was 40 years ago and some of us girls have had daughters who have gone on to be coached by Joy. She was a respected referee - nobody messed with her decisions!

We will all miss her and are grateful for her time and devotion she has given to Aylsham children (and adults) over the years. We will miss her England flags on her car and her pink hair. We send our deepest sympathy to Matthew and Jenny and all her family.

Joy's funeral will take place at 3pm on Friday, 31 March at St Michael's church, followed by a celebration of her life from 4pm in the town hall. Her family would be happy to see as many of you there who are able to attend and share your memories.
