We have a lot of lost property already!

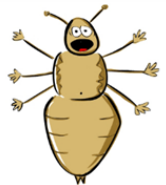


If your child is missing anything, please come to the school office, who will point you in the direction of the lost property box.

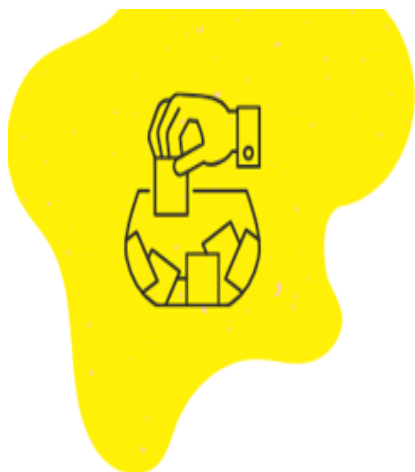

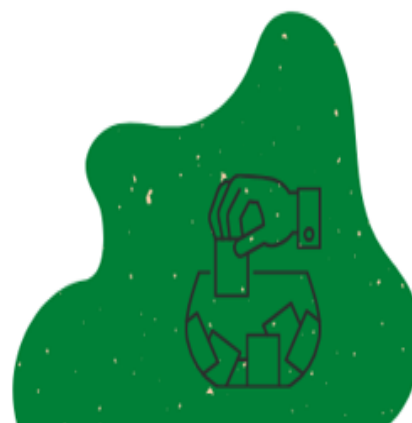
Now Live on ParentPay - £12 for the year

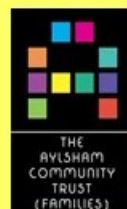

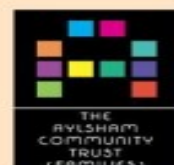
