ATTENDANCE


As we now move towards the last week of this half term, we continue to monitor attendance closely across our school. We do so because we have to, and we have to, because research highlights the positive relationship between good school attendance, good attainment and positive life outcomes.

These graphs taken from FFT education data lab show that attainment declines as absence increases.



% pupils achieving the expected standard in KS2 reading, writing & maths by absence, 2022/23

State-funded mainstream schools



We recognise that absence may be a contributory factor to low attainment, but it may not be the only reason why some children achieve lower outcomes at the end of Key Stage 2 or as they progress on to high school. We also recognise that pupil attendance is complex and that for some families and individuals there are a multitude of reasons why their school attendance percentage is lower than we would like.

This message is not a moan or warning, it simply outlines why we place so much importance on children attending school and why we must continue to work in partnership for the benefit of our children. Not because we want them to score highly in a national test, but because we want to give them the best possible life chances moving forward.
